Describe activities

We have formed a partnership with a local college, Truman State University. With this partnership we have integrated a program where the students observe and may student teach in our building to obtain college credit. We then have a network formed for recruiting highly qualified applicants for any openings we may have that we have assisted in training. Our administration also participates in mock interviews and job fairs and colleges in Missouri. Job vacancies are posted on MO Teaching Jobs to allow for most exposure for qualified candidates.

Assisting preschool children in the transition from early childhood education programs to local elementary school programs

Describe activities

Our district has a preschool within the building. The elementary teachers and the preschool teacher have direct communication about what support students will need for transition into elementary school. Preschool students are able to have a "practice day" in the Kindergarten classroom before school begins.
